*Regulations for Conducting the Survey of Land in New Zealand.*

IN pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by "The New Zealand Institute of Surveyors and Board of Examiners Act, 1900," the Surveyors' Board doth hereby amend the regulations for conducting the survey of land in New Zealand, made on the eighth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the twenty-ninth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and seven, by the substitution of the following Schedule for Schedule E thereof:—

SCHEDULE E.

*Statutory Declaration verifying Plan.*
