STEP (LANDONLINE REPLACEMENT)

The pilot of the new Landonline survey interface continues, now with an extended group of 31 users across the motu. It is really encouraging to see that feedback from the Survey Working Group continues to be incorporated into the new tool as we go along. Most recently, the ability to add and delete vectors and marks has been added. The Working Group continues to advocate for a number of additional enhancements, notably the ability to add and edit new parcels. The speed of editing in the new interface, particularly when used for large datasets continues to be of concern, and the development team are working on this. Cool new features include the ability to preview all requested TA certificates in their entirety:



And the new easement schedule tool, which gives a nice preview of existing instruments registered on the title:



In terms of rolling the new interface out to a larger group of users, the current plan is to add around 100 more users from 75 firms across the country over the next 3 months, in order to begin building a community of power users. It will also be rolled out to students at the University of Otago later this year, in the hope that graduates entering the profession will have experience of the new interface under their belts. There is still no hard date for a general roll out to the wider profession.
